

# 2024 FTTA Gospel Trips Report and Prayer Burdens 4 January 25, 2024

## AFRICA

### Ethiopia

*January 23*

Today we had our first coordination with the serving team and some of the Full-Time Training in Addis Ababa (FTTAA) trainees. The saints here spend 3.5 hours every morning to overflow. The desire of the saints to be constituted with the truth is so strong! We preached the gospel at the Addis Ababa Science and Technology University (AASTU). We are not allowed to go into the campus, so we contacted people near the entrance.

One dormant brother was brought back to the church and he expressed his joy of coming back, and all the saints rejoiced with him.

*January 24*

Together with the FTTAA trainees, we were able to reach a comparable number of students at AASTU as yesterday. We also met two contacts who were open to being baptized.

## ASIA

### Singapore

*January 24*

Today we had Bible studies with students from Singapore Management University. We also preached the gospel to students on campus. Some prayed to receive the Lord. One girl we met was very open to join our Bible studies. In the evening, we had our Full-time Training in Anaheim (FTTA) presentation with current and past trainees. A good number of saints of different ages came to listen to our testimonies. The interest about the training is very strong from the young saints.

*January 25*

We had a Bible study at Singapore Institute of Management, and preached the gospel to the students there and at Ngee Ann Polytechnic. One person received the Lord! In the evening, we had a campus gathering which had approximately 50 students from four college campuses. There was a burden for the gospel friends who had believed to get baptized.

Prayer burdens:

1. That the Lord would water the seeds planted in all the saints' hearts at the FTTA presentation, and train them according to Him.
2. That the Lord would gain much remaining fruit through the gospel preaching on Singapore campuses.
3. That the gospel friends of the college students would be baptized.
4. That the young people at the Pre-University meeting on Friday, January 26, would be touched by the burden of the message to give their teenage years to the Lord.
5. That the Lord would gain many contacts for the college gospel meeting on Thursday, January 25.

## Japan

*January 25*

The sanctifying Spirit has gone before us and 15 students have prayed to receive the Lord this week. The highlight of our day was joining the small group meetings in the Tokyo area.

Prayer burdens:

1. That the Lord will continue to open the eyes of those that received Him and turn them from darkness to light.
2. That the gospel tracts that are in the hands and homes would continue to speak.

## EUROPE

### Baltic Countries (Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania)

*January 24*

Today we coordinated with the local saints in Vilnius, Lithuania, and some visiting saints from Latvia and the UK. We went out together to Old Town Vilnius to preach the gospel. There were a few open ones with whom we exchanged information. We hope to meet some again for second contact and to get them connected to local saints.

Prayer burdens:

1. For the ones who have been contacted to continue to be open to the Lord and to the saints.
2. For the Lord to release His word during the Baltic-Nordic Blending Conference taking place Friday, January 26, to Lord's day, January 28.



# Bulgaria / Romania

*January 25*

This morning we sang hymns and handed out Bibles and Rhema sets at the Grozavesti Station in Bucharest. We were joined by 3 local saints and successfully handed out 150 Bibles and got the contact information of some Romanian students. We also reconnected with some contacts from last year's gospel trip.

Prayer burdens:

1. For the Lord to keep working in the 4 contacts from last year and that we may see them again.
2. For the follow-up communication and for appointments with contacts from the Grozavesti Station to be released this week or early next week.
3. For the Romanian university students to be warm in our going out again on Friday, January 26.

# Poland (Krakow)

*January 24*

On Wednesday, we joined coordination with the Krakow full-time team. We passed out Bible study flyers and gospel tracts at Akademia Wychowania Fizycznego (Academy of Physical Education) and Politechnika Krakowska (Krakow University of Technology).

*January 25*

On Thursday, we hosted a Bible study. One student had been invited many times in the past but showed up for the first time today.

Prayer burdens:

1. For when the trainees visit different homes on Friday, January 26, and for this to be a time of mutuality, opening, and blending.

3. For a time of blending on Lord's Day, January 28, between the cities of Krakow, Sosnowiec, and Opole (around 50-70 saints expected), that this would be a time for the gospel in Katowice.
4. For remaining fruit for this gospel time on January 28, that the local saints would be able to join and have a good experience on the gospel.
5. For good weather on the campuses and city center, because the past two days have been rainy.

We distributed Bibles and passed out fliers for our Pizza Connect event on Friday, January 26 at the University of Life Sciences (SGGW) in Warsaw. We had 3 regular appointments and 6 visitations.

*January 25*

Some saints, including a couple of full-timers, drove us from Albuquerque to Flagstaff to continue our gospel trip in Arizona. We will spend four days in Flagstaff, blending with the saints and joining the campus work at Northern Arizona University (NAU).

The saints in Flagstaff received us with a fellowship dinner, followed by prayers for the campus work here. We heard encouraging testimonies from some faithful saints of what the Lord has been doing in this city over the years.

## Northeast

### Upstate New York

*January 24*

In the morning, we blended with the staff of Kingston Penuel Christian Camp (KPCC). We had lunch at State University of New York (SUNY) New Paltz, had follow-up appointments with students we met on Tuesday, and continued to table for Bibles for America. The day ended with a neighborhood children's meeting in Rosendale.

Our follow-up appointments were very encouraging! We met many seeking believers on campus and we are praying for their going on with the saints in the area.

*January 25*

The team left KPCC and traveled to Troy/Albany where we met the saints living in the brothers' house/student center near Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. We then took a tour of the campus and prayed for the campus club and students.

It is very encouraging to see how many students are going on here on a campus that had no campus work 5 years ago, does not have a full-time team, and has very few students who grew up in the church life.

Within two hours, 90 tracts, 53 Bibles were distributed, and 5 prayed to receive the Lord! In the evening, we held a snack time as Christian Students at UNR (University of Nevada, Reno) at the campus house and 3 new ones showed up.
