January 30, 2025

EUROPE

Austria / Hungary / Slovakia

January 30

We thank the Lord for another day in Košice. We had beautiful weather today for our gospel work. The people we met today were also open. May the Lord continually bless people who have received tracts, a Bible, and/or booklets with Himself. May the Lord operate in those contacts and bring them into the Body as remaining fruit!

Belgium / The Netherlands

January 30

We went to Delft for Bible distribution. We gave out 6 Bibles and some booklets by the shopping center close to the train station. Later, we went to Hema to have lunch with the saints who were with us at the Bible distribution for almost two hours. In the late afternoon, we went to a community center where church meetings are usually held to have dinner with saints from Rotterdam and Delft for a combined home meeting and students' meeting. We will blend with the saints in Utrecht, Spakenburg, and Urk for the next 3 days.

Prayer burdens:

1. For a church meeting hall in Delft.
2. For more students to be gained in Delft, as there is only one undergraduate sister who is a university freshman.
3. For the Recovery Version of the Bible to be translated in Dutch. There is a need for a Dutch translation of both the Old Testament and the New Testament.
4. That the Lord would continue making His home in our hearts and that He would make Himself so real to each one of us and continue strengthening the saints here in Rotterdam and Delft to have fellowship with Him every day.
5. That the Lord would be the light to those who received the Bible and booklets today.

France (Paris 1 - Center)

January 30

This morning, we had a good time of fellowship with two saints from Paris who shared their testimonies with us. We also received contact information from multiple students who are open to meeting again. Two on the team had an appointment while the rest distributed Bibles.

One of our contacts has been Christian all her life but recently has been more seeking; she is starting to read Matthew 1 with another Bible study group but she is still quite open to us. One particular student was very attentive and grasped what we were saying. We spoke to him for ~20 minutes before he invited us to have pizza. One of the trainee brothers went with him and spent an hour with him. The student shared his struggles and said that it was fate that he came to campus and met us today, because of his situation and because he had felt like giving up. He is very seeking for human connection and open for another appointment.

France (Paris 2 - Nanterre)

January 28

On Tuesday, the local saints and the brothers and sisters on the team had appointments with new ones to shepherd one another. We felt a seamless immersion into the burden of the saints for these contacts.

January 29

41 Bibles were distributed and 11 contacts were gained on a rainy day in Paris. The people of Nanterre were intrigued as to why we were out in the cold and rain. This testimony of the Lord seemed to draw people in.

January 30

Today we met a French student for lunch, and later her fiancé joined us. We gave her fiancé a Bible and we are praying that they would join the meetings.

Prayer burdens:

1. That the Lord would add at least one consistent contact to the church life in Nanterre.
2. That our current contacts would remain open to us and genuinely hunger for the zoe (divine) life.



France (Paris 3 - Versailles)

January 28

Today we went back to the Versailles-Chantiers station to distribute Bibles and preach the gospel. The location did not seem as busy as the previous day, but we still had positive results. We noticed that some of the locals who initially rejected us would later return to ask for a Bible and have a conversation. It was truly encouraging to see the Lord working in these seeking ones to change their mind and bring them back. Tomorrow, we will try to distribute Bibles near some university campuses in Versailles. There are only a few campuses here and it will be the first time for the team and the local saints to be preaching in these areas.

France (Paris 4 - Palaiseau)

January 28

Today the majority of the team went to a train station and distributed 42 Bibles. One man who received a Bible said that he had been needing one and showed the saints his own Bible, which was falling apart. He gave us his contact information, as did several others who took Bibles.

The other two sisters had a lunch appointment with a freshman student who was met by one of the sisters while riding the bus. The appointment was spent talking about human matters, but she was very willing to come to dinner at the meeting hall this evening. When she came, it became very clear that the Lord had divinely arranged for her to meet the saints. Although her family is not Christian, she said that she was a Christian because she had Christian friends in high school. When asked if she had ever prayed to receive the Lord, however, she replied that she didn't know how. We gave her a free Bible and went through "The Mystery of Human Life", and she prayed to receive the Lord! She lingered for a while after the meeting and said multiple times that she wants to come back tomorrow night for the student Bible study. Her heart seems so soft and open toward the Lord, and our prayer is that she would become remaining fruit.

A gospel friend of a brother in Nanterre also attended the dinner, and at the very end of the time she received the Lord as well. She took a free Bible and wants to come back next week.

Prayer burdens:

1. For the two sisters who prayed to receive the Lord today—that the Lord would keep them coming back and arrange the right ones to be their shepherds and companions.
2. For the dinner and Bible study Friday night. More student contacts will be coming, and we are hoping to connect them to each other as well as to the local saints.

France (Rouen/Dieppe)

January 30

Today, we toured the University of Rouen Normandy and handed out tracts and Bibles. The brothers contacted a student and invited him to lunch, where he received a tract and a Bible. In the afternoon, we set up a table near the university and distributed Bibles and tracts for around an hour. In the evening, the brothers had an appointment with a local brother and some of his friends while the sisters had an appointment with a local family.

January 29

Today, we spent the day in Dieppe to visit some saints in their homes. A brother hosted our team and some local saints for lunch, and then the sisters visited a mother and her young daughter. We also welcomed a couple who just arrived in Dieppe and who will be living in Rouen for the next year. Afterwards, we joined the Dieppe prayer meeting via Zoom, held in French and English.

Prayer burdens:

1. That we would have a second appointment with the contacts gained on January 30—either at the Saturday home meeting, or a one-on-one appointment
2. For contacts to advance to have a vision of God's economy for the continuation of their living.
3. That a home could be secured for the in Dieppe to move into and for the saints in Rouen to meet in.
4. For the Lord to speak a timely word to the saints in Dieppe during the conference this Lord's Day.



France (Strasbourg)

January 28-29

On January 28, we tabled for Bibles for Europe on the University of Strasbourg campus with some local saints. We attended prayer meetings online and in person. On January 29, we tabled for Bibles for America at a plaza with some of the saints. In the evening, we had dinner with a family and their children.

1. That the Lord would be able to capture many young college students during our gospel time on the campus.
2. For the strengthening of the testimony in Frankfurt.
3. For all the saints and trainees to stay healthy during this cold winter.

Germany (Düsseldorf)

January 30

After breakfast and coordination with the saints in Essen, we spent several hours at the University of Duisburg-Essen. We ate lunch with three students and met two more at our apartment building. We planned to meet up again with some students tomorrow, and we invited several to the Friday night student meeting.

Spain

January 27-29

We preached the gospel in two teams: one team went to University of Barcelona (UB) and the other to Polytechnic University of Catalonia (UPC). At UB, we mostly spoke with international students. They were generally open to receiving at least tracts, but many others were also open to having conversations. Some even received the Lord! At UPC, we had a good number of conversations with the students. After eating lunch with the saints in Barcelona, we went out around the area handing out gospel tracts of John and Bibles.

Prayer burden:

1. That the students would read the tracts and reach out to the church in Barcelona to get connected to the Body.

Luxembourg

January 30

We have been very impressed and encouraged with our coordination times that are conducted in English, Spanish, and French. These times have been wonderful, and the Lord has had a way to truly pour out His blessing in Luxembourg. Today, we passed out 49 Bibles. People were very open and came up to our table. We met a Muslim girl who prayed to receive the Lord after speaking with us. She is open to meet us again soon. Another woman who is Catholic was very positive and wants to meet with us for lunch to read the Bible next Tuesday.

Prayer burdens:

1. For the appointments we made with the Muslim woman and Catholic woman to be kept and for the enemy to be bound.
2. For the brothers' appointment tomorrow, January 31 with a new one who received the Lord yesterday.
3. For the health of our team and that the gospel would not be hindered in any way.

Norway

January 29-30

For the past two days, we distributed Bibles at the University of Oslo. Today, we distributed all the Bibles in Oslo. Our time on the campus distributing Bibles has been very positive already, but today we found that people were even more open than before. One girl said that she has been thinking about how she needs to read the Bible, but she had lost hers while moving. When she saw us, she said, "That's the book I've been looking for!"

She was very encouraged that we visited. We had dinner with a couple who met the saints here in Lausanne a year and a half ago. Then, we arrived safely to Geneva, where we will spend the rest of our time. Tomorrow, we will meet a sister in Geneva for lunch who is also not able to meet because her home is too far from the meeting in Lausanne.

Prayer burdens:

1. For the going on of the saints that are scattered because of the distance.
2. That there would not be any hindrances in our tripartite being for the rest of our time here in Geneva.
3. That the Lord would brood over the hearts of many contacts as we prepare to contact them soon.

NORTH AMERICA

Mid-Atlantic

Washington, D.C.

January 28-29

We started the day with coordination and enjoying the Lord. We pray-read, sang, and read *The Jubilee*. Afterwards we split into 2 campuses, Georgetown University (GU) and George Washington University (GWU),

The team had tabling again in Ohio State University (OSU) today. This time some of the local saints also got to join us at the table and to hand out the flyers. Later in the day trainees joined the team for the Bible study on campus at which one of our trainee brothers gave the message. There were over 50 people at the Bible study, even some that we invited at tabling earlier this week. Then the students and trainees were invited to join the dinner at some local saints' houses.

The trainees read *The Jubilee* corporately with the team and had blending lunch afterwards. Some trainee brothers joined appointments with students and a trainee sister joined the neighborhood children's meeting with 8 in attendance. Then in the evening the sisters went to the Young Adults Meeting (YAM) where a student gave his testimony. Meanwhile, the brothers had a blending dinner in a saint's home.

January 28

Today was the second day at the University of Missouri–St. Louis (UMSL) and St. Louis Community College (STLCC) campuses. During coordination, we continued to focus on enjoying the Lord first. Some working saints attended coordination and went with us to the campuses.

Many students are very open and desiring to get a Bible or join a Bible study. At STLCC, all the Bibles were distributed. Students have also been enjoying the ministry; several copies have been distributed of *Spiritual Nourishment*, a publication that acts as a devotional with excerpts from Watchman Nee and Witness Lee. Furthermore, a total of 70 students in the past two days have signed up for a Bible study with 90% of those students being local Missourians from STLCC. The Lord is really operating to gain local Missourians by stirring up a hunger in the students at STLCC.

January 29

We had a Bible study with students at the University of Missouri–St. Louis (UMSL). There were 24 attendees in total, 15 of which were connections saints had made at the school through the campus work. We first had lunch together and then read chapter two of 2 Corinthians in groups, followed by discussions and overflows within the groups. At UMSL the Bible study has been the main way by which the serving ones facilitate contact and build

relationships with the newly connected students, from which point they could then further connect them with the saints in the homes.

The team distributed materials at Saint Louis University (SLU). SLU has not been as receptive in the receiving of material, but the table held a strategic location at which came waves of students. Tracts were the main means of contacting students. Our burden in passing out the tracts is that they would be sown with blessings to many (2 Cor. 9:6).

Half of the trainees attended the Bible study, the other half remained at the tables to continue conversations and distribute gospel materials.

We have been enjoying the fruits of the posters that we hung up all around campus on Monday. In the evening, we had a pizza social event where we got to know each other better. We enjoyed a fellowship about the Lord and what He has been doing on this campus, and then there was a word of inoculation to all the students present.

One woman was in tears because she had been praying for a Bible to give to her son, and we also met a few students who seemed interested in the club meetings. Afterwards, the team split into two homes for some sweet, intimate fellowship with some of the local saints and students.
