Report and Prayer Burdens 5

January 19, 2026

EUROPE

Italy (Turin)

January 17

We began the day with fellowship and prayer at the meeting hall in Milan. We initially gathered together both with the local saints in Milan and the teams in Padua and Vicenza, going over a newly printed gospel tract in Italian that spoke of Christ being the bread of life for us to eat. We then split off into our own respective subteams and prayed for our time in Turin. Our fellowship for Turin was to gain personal contacts and connections through our distribution, with a goal of having follow-up appointments and one-on-one shepherding. Many contacts from the third round of Italy gospel trips (TR3) were also interested in continual shepherding, which was another burden for our time there.

After our meeting, we ate lunch together near the train station and departed at 2:30 to head for Turin. We got to Turin without any delays and headed to our hospitality arrangements. We ended the night with dinner in groups around Turin.

January 18

Today, we had a Lord's table meeting with the local saints from Turin and the surrounding cities. There were around 55 saints, consisting of the local saints and the gospel team. The three languages represented at the meeting were English, Italian, and Chinese. For lunch, the local saints graciously packed us sack lunches for us to enjoy.

Afterwards, a gospel contact, K, who was gained from TR3, wanted to be baptized that afternoon! Around 25 saints from Turin, Milan, and the team went to support K's baptism. A, another contact from TR3, also met with one of the brothers on the team for an appointment that evening.

January 19

We started the day with corporate enjoyment, prayer, and coordination, as well as reading *The World Situation and the Direction of the Lord's Move*. After coordination, we split off into two groups to preach the gospel. One group tabled at Palazzo Nuovo at the University of Turin, and the other group at Turin's south train station.

A was available for another appointment in the afternoon today, and during the appointment expressed an interest in getting baptized sometime this week.

In the afternoon and evening, some local saints opened their homes to have members of the team over for fellowship and blending. Other members of the team had dinner with one another to be blent and built up together.

Italy (Vicenza)

January 16

On our first day, the saints met together at the hall in Milan to enjoy the Lord and release strong prayers for the start of the gospel trips in Turin, Vicenza, and Padua. There was a strong testimony of the oneness in the Lord with many saints from many countries joining the Lord's work in Italy. May the Lord bless the start of these gospel trips.

January 18

Lord's Day began with a Lord's table meeting with saints coming from Padua to join. Over 50 saints attended, compared with the usual attendance of around a dozen saints. Some saints even had to sit outside of the room due to the limited capacity.

Just before the meeting, a sister who was picking up saints from Padua at the station mistakenly picked up a stranger to go to the table meeting. He turned out to be a brother in the Lord from India! He was expecting to join a different meeting but was pleasantly surprised when he joined our table meeting. He was encouraged to see so many joyful saints enjoying the Lord together.

After the table, we were split off into different homes to enjoy a love feast with the local saints. It was a sweet time of fellowship and blending with the local saints in the homes, being fed with the overflow of food and their portion of Christ.

Prayer burdens:

1. That the Lord would reach many hungry and thirsty ones whom He has called out through the distributions starting January 19.
2. For the saints to enjoy the Lord in their morning and coordination times to stay in the one flow of the Lord's work for the spreading of the gospel.



Italy (Padua)

January 18

The subteams from Vicenza and Padua met in Vicenza for the Lord's Day meeting. When the saints from the Padua team were being picked up to go to the meeting, another fellow believer in the Lord was mistaken for one of them. The saints then invited him, and he ended up coming to the meeting. After enjoying the meeting, he came to lunch in a saint's home. He wants to get further connected with the saints this week and to come to the Lord's Day meeting again next week.

January 19

After fellowship and coordination in the morning, we split into two groups to announce the good news of the gospel. One group went to the University of Padua and the other went to the city. Some positive contacts were open to further contact, including a young woman from Turkey and a seeking sister from Lebanon who is available for lunch on Tuesday.

January 17

Our team arrived in Ann Arbor on Saturday night and has been spending much of our time getting to know the saints, students, and young people in the area. That evening, we were warmly welcomed with a dinner at the meeting hall with the saints from Ann Arbor and Farmington.

During the welcome dinner, we had the opportunity to share our testimonies with the saints. Northeast

Connecticut

January 17-18

We arrived in Woodbridge and got settled with our hospitality Saturday evening, joining the small group fellowship in the homes. There was a large snowstorm over the weekend, so many of the saints were limited in their travel to meet for both Saturday home meeting and the Lord's table meeting in the morning. Those who were able to safely travel still gathered together at the hall Lord's Day morning for the Lord's table and prophesying meeting.
