Report and Prayer Burdens 7

January 21, 2026

EUROPE

Germany (Düsseldorf)

January 21

In the morning we had an online group orientation session with all the gospel teams visiting Europe, followed by a Germany-specific orientation/fellowship session. In these sessions the brothers conveyed the burden that we would personally see and become burdened for the Lord's ultimate move in Europe, and render Him the proper cooperation not by a movement but a living that enjoys and magnifies Christ to all those around. In the afternoon we traveled from Frankfurt to Dusseldorf via train, and in the evening we had a sweet time of fellowship with the local saints at a welcome dinner. In the next two days (1/22-1/23) we will be traveling daily to the city of Essen to table at the University of Duisburg-Essen (UDE) as well as having dinner/meetings with the saints in their homes in the evenings.

Prayer burdens:

1. That all the participants of this trip would gain a fresh and controlling vision regarding the Lord's final move in Europe and consecrate themselves to live a life for His return.
2. For the Lord to bring many hungry and seeking ones to us at UDE during our time there (1/22-1/23), and that these ones would remain.
3. For the Lord to release the blending and the fellowship with the local saints in the evenings for much building and mutual shepherding.

Italy (Turin)

January 20

We started the day with coordination and overflow from the previous day of distribution. Praise the Lord, there was such a positive response! One sister on the team shared that almost every person she approached was open to praying with her, despite there being a language barrier. Another sister shared that when she asked people for one minute of their time, almost everyone stopped to listen to what she had to say. As a result, we were able to schedule five appointments with new contacts today.

Due to heightened police presence, we were unable to set up tables today and opted to go out in twos to preach the gospel. Even with this limitation, we were able to gain 17 new contacts who were interested in further contact. For this week, the fellowship was to invite the contacts to the homes to practice the house-to-house church life.

In the evening, we split off into two groups for dinner, one group at a local saint's home and the other in a team member's Airbnb. We had an appointment with a contact, O, that afternoon, who was then open to come to the saint's house for dinner. O is seeking for a Christian group to be with, and we are praying that O will find home in the church!

January 21

We started the day with a joint Zoom call connecting teams from across Europe, including Germany, France, Italy, Luxembourg, Portugal, and Poland. The burden for this time was to impress the saints with the Lord's current move throughout all of Europe, as well as show the importance of gaining Europe for the Lord's second coming. May the Lord gain many for His move in this continent!

In the afternoon, we were able to resume tabling and distribution. Because of the continual openness, another five appointments were able to be set up for today! We were able to speak with people who knew Italian, Spanish, French, Portuguese, and English. After today, more than 500 tracts have been passed out and over 40 Bibles have been given out.

We split off into two groups again, one group being at a local saint's home. There, the local saints expressed that they were so encouraged by the openness of the Italian people and the spread of the gospel. They testified that previously, in a week they were only able to distribute two Bibles, but now their prayer is that the Lord would establish His lampstand in Turin through these gospel trips.

Prayer burdens:

1. That those who desire further contact would be open and responsive to having appointments with the team.
2. That many new contacts would be open to come to dinner in the homes for fellowship and shepherding.
3. That O will stay in contact with us and continue to have a soft and open heart.

Italy (Vicenza)

January 19

For the gospel today, we split up into two teams: one team to go to a campus (Complesso Universitario di Viale Margherita) and the other team to go to the downtown city area. Both teams received positive responses from the ones contacted and many Italians were happy to receive the tracts distributed. During the evening fellowship, we coordinated for visitation trips to the saints who were opening up their homes throughout the week.

A brother we just met, S, who came to the Lord's table meeting yesterday, was also invited and he ended up coming to eat with us. We were able to fellowship with him regarding his experience with the Lord from Hinduism and to share with him our testimonies of Christ, which he appreciated.

In the evening there were some visits to some homes. Today was a special day because the Olympic torch was passing through Vicenza and there was an event set up in the Piazza dei Signori. Some saints joined the event with the gospel contacts and were able to see the torch being passed on.

January 17

As the trainees arrived in Sacramento, the local saints and college students warmly welcomed us into their meeting hall with a love feast! With much love and care, the saints also prepared a presentation of the rich history of the Lord's Recovery in the Sacramento Valley. The saints labored abundantly through the years, and we all felt very appreciative that we could enter into His move in this area!

January 18

Our first Lord's table meeting in Sacramento was a rich blending of all the churches in the Sacramento Valley. We all gathered in the church in Sacramento and it was announced that the churches would be kicking off 2026 as a year of gospel preaching - a gospel festival.

January 19

Today, trainees, full-time serving ones, community saints, and college students joined for coordination at the church in Davis and a gospel "stroll" through University of California, Davis. During coordination we enjoyed the matter of praying in intimate fellowship with the Lord before any work or petition. Before we went out on our gospel time, we had a time of prayer for the campus.

Since it was a holiday, there were very few students on the campus, but we were still able to hand out 43 tracts, converse with six people, and one student prayed to receive the Lord!
