

2026 FTTA Gospel Trips

Report and Prayer Burdens 9

January 23, 2026

EUROPE

Germany (Düsseldorf)

January 22

This was our first day handing out Bibles and preaching the gospel at the University of Duisburg-Essen (UDE) in the city of Essen. The students were surprisingly open to us. We handed out 70 tracts and 41 Bibles and had conversations with 11 people with 1 praying to receive the Lord. One young couple we contacted was particularly open and quite eager to have further contact with us, expressing that they have been seeking for the proper church to meet with for a while. Three of our contacts are looking to join the dinner and Bible study at a saint's home on Friday evening, January 23.

January 23

Today, we tabled at UDE again. We handed out 49 (likely under-counted) tracts, 18 Bibles, and had conversations with 23 people. In the evening, we had a wonderful dinner and Bible study at a saint's home where the three new ones we contacted the day before attended and enjoyed! Two also brought their friends and thus 5 new ones attended in a meeting of 27 in total. The saints in Essen are also very burdened to obtain a meeting facility in the student center close to the central train station, and are very close to being able to use it.

Prayer burdens:

1. That the Lord would continue sweeping in the hearts of the students in Essen and Düsseldorf to gain many, and that we would render the proper care for the ones He has connected us with.
2. That the Lord would continue to draw these 5 new ones who came to the Bible study, in particular the young couple who is seeking the church.
3. For the timely release of the facility in the student center in Essen for the saints to meet at and reach the students.



Ireland

January 22

After arriving in Dublin, due to the weather, much of our time was spent indoors having times of fellowship and prayer. In the evening, we joined a zoom call with the saints in Ukraine, listening to a short speaking and a Q/R time. Afterward we joined some saints for dinner.

January 23

The weather cleared up today and we took the opportunity to hand out gospel tracts at Trinity College. In the evening the trainees split with the brothers attending a college meeting, which mainly included students from Trinity College and the Technological University of Dublin (TUD). The sisters attended a small group meeting, getting the chance to blend with local saints.

Prayer burdens:

1. That the Lord would gain a testimony among the local Irish people.
2. That the Lord would release the proper property for a meeting hall.



Luxembourg

January 20

The Paris Hub teams arrived in Paris from morning until evening. We heard from local saints and those who had just begun serving in various European cities—some arriving months ago and others just days before us. We were also joined by eight visiting saints from China and Malaysia, including one student. After dinner, we all gathered for an orientation where we received an overview of the Lord's move in French-speaking countries and an introduction to the history of Italy, Ireland, Portugal, and Spain.

January 21

After the second fellowship with the hub in the morning concerning the Lord's move, we traveled for a couple of hours. We had dinner and a prayer meeting at an open home in Belval. There were 13 of us in person, including the hosts and a trainee couple visiting from Brazil. This will be the full Luxembourg team until February. Another couple was praying online. They do not speak English and most of us do not speak French. The hosts encouraged us to pray in French if we could. It was a sweet time of fellowship and getting to know one another.

January 22

In the morning, we spent some considerable time fellowshipping and preparing for our visitation of a local family who was met last March. Some of the children of this family went to the Winter School of Truth at the end of December 2025. We spent some time singing, had dinner together and got to know them a little more. Even though language may be a barrier, the Lord was able to make this visitation sweet after all. They invited us to have lunch together next time and walked us to the bus station.

Prayer burdens:

1. For the Lord to release the children of this family to attend the French-speaking young people's conference at the end of February.
2. That the Lord would release the baptisms of the children of this family, and gain all of them including the father, for the raising up of the church in Luxembourg.

NORTH AMERICA

Mid-Atlantic

Pennsylvania

January 20

After coordination we went to the University of Pittsburgh (Pitt) for tabling and gospel preaching. We had several positive contacts. A student that we met during tabling came for the campus Bible study that very evening! He brought his new Recovery Version with him. We studied chapter one of Matthew. The students also enjoyed getting into the footnotes of their new Bibles and were underlining portions. We had eight students join.

January 21

Pitt and CMU (Carnegie Mellon University) both had their club fairs on this day. We took shifts tabling and going out for the gospel. We are learning how to start meaningful conversations and enjoying prayer times together. At the CMU Bible study that evening, we had fourteen students join! Several students who just joined brought their friends with them. It has been encouraging to see the Lord work.

January 22

After the morning fellowship we tabled at CMU. We met new students and also ran into students we knew/had lost contact with. Thank You Lord for Your arrangements! We had lunch with different students and contacts. In the afternoon we had appointments and visited saints. That evening we had dinner together at the home of some saints and enjoyed sweet fellowship.

January 20

The team started the morning with personal time and coordination before beginning outreach on the University of Wisconsin-Madison campus (this was the first day of school for the spring semester). We set up two Christian Students at University of Wisconsin tables, handed out flyers with the welcome week events, handed out tracts/Bibles, and had many conversations over 30 seconds with the students. Some divine appointments with the students and visitations with the saints were also arranged. In the evening, we were able to join a time with the current students over dinner and fellowship regarding the club this semester as well as participate in the prayer meeting.

January 21

The team once again started the morning with personal time, coordination, and much prayer regarding our gospel outreach, contacts, and welcome dinner. We then continued the outreach on campus, meeting with students, and spending time with the saints. In the evening, we prepared the hall and food for the welcome dinner. The welcome dinner was a very enjoyable time and the Lord brought 15 new students, 14 returning students, 14 other adults, 1 young person, and 2 children.

We had dinner and fellowship, and found that a lot of the students were meeting each other for the first time. The fellowship was very positive with many making future plans to meet again.

January 17-18

We landed in the afternoon of January 17, and directly headed to the young people's meeting. We enjoyed the conversation with the young people and gave our testimonies of how we decided to go to the training. This is the first time for some of the young people to hear about the training. On January 18, we had the Lord's table with the local saints, and got invited to eat with the local saints and students, so that we can get to know the saints' sweet testimonies about how they decided to immigrate to Orlando. In the brothers' hospitality, they helped the friend of the host to pray to receive the Lord. Afterwards, we had sports time with the students at the University of Central Florida (UCF). This granted us more opportunities to blend with the students and get to know them, especially one student who just met the saints when they were tabling. She is a freshman going to school, but her heart was just attracted by the pure environment and the saints' love for the Lord. She continues to meet with the saints in UCF.

January 19

The full-time team shared the history of the formation of the church in Orlando and the start of the campus work at UCF. They began with six full-timers serving on the campus, and they didn't know how to do it at first. But the Lord richly blessed them, and the first students they met were attracted by their pure heart, even though it was during the pandemic.

After that, we had an outing with some of the key core students. During dinner time, we had a progressive dinner. We went to three different saints' houses for appetizers, main course, and dessert respectively, and we stayed at each house for around one hour. In this way, we had more opportunities to have further conversations with the local saints. They also have this progressive dinner each year to bring the students to multiple saints' houses. In this way, many saints become connected with the students and start to have the burden to take care of them.

January 17–18

A conference was held with approximately 260 saints in attendance. Through fellowship and prayer, about 120 saints were stirred and joined the gospel burden. The time strengthened the saints and prepared them for the gospel outreach in the days that followed.

January 19

Monday, around 120 saints gathered in Charleston to open the way for Bible distribution. Approximately 700–800 Bibles and 1,600 Christian literature books were distributed on the first day. Many saints joined joyfully, and the Lord clearly opened the way for the saints to function together. We sensed the Lord opening both the hearts of the saints and the hearts of the people to receive.

January 20

On Tuesday, we were divided into three groups and went with the local saints to preach the gospel on three different campuses. In each interaction, our focus was not only Bible distribution but also impromptu Bible studies. Several people were open to having impromptu Bible studies on the spot, and some also received the Lord.

January 21

Wednesday was a rest and travel day as we traveled from Charleston to Myrtle Beach. In the evening, we were warmly received in the homes of the local saints and enjoyed a sweet time of fellowship and blending.
