Report and Prayer Burdens 10

January 24, 2026

EUROPE

France (Paris)

January 22

During our past two gospel outreach days at Sorbonne Université, we had many meaningful conversations with students. Many contacts expressed appreciation for the free Bible because they had a desire to know the word more deeply. One man told us he received a Bible from us last time. He has been reading it alongside his other Bible and was very grateful to have received it from us.

Some are already reading their Bible regularly, while others are new but open to starting. Several students are willing to meet again soon for coffee, and a few are planning to attend the Saturday seminar.

It was very encouraging to see many new faces of local students attending home meetings and one prayed to receive the Lord! This same one came again the following night, and despite having a hard time finding the meeting place, we enjoyed the fellowship on Ephesians 3. We were encouraged that this one did not give up and still joined the rest of the meeting.

Prayer burdens:

1. For follow-up appointments to be solidified.
2. For the Saturday Bible seminar (1/31), that those who expressed interest would be released to attend.
3. For the release of visas for the remaining six saints to join the full-time team in Paris, and for the strengthening of the Lord's move here.
4. For our time in Lille at the first Lord's table meeting, that the Lord would be glorified and expressed!



France (Toulouse)

January 21

We met with those in the Paris Hub and fellowship with all the teams across Europe. The brothers were sharing about the burden of the Lord's move in Europe and how we can cooperate with Him by living Christ. We spent the rest of the day traveling to Toulouse.

January 22

Our team got together in the morning with some local saints for prayer and coordination. There have been many new ones contacted within the last year who have been meeting regularly and several have been inviting their friends and family to the meetings! With so many new ones, the fellowship was to focus more of our time on visitations to spend time with and shepherd the saints.

In the afternoon, we headed to Université Toulouse-Jean-Jaurès to distribute Bibles. We talked to several students who prayed to receive the Lord and a couple who were interested in a second appointment. For dinner, the brothers visited a couple saints and the sisters met up with a student. We were very touched by their testimonies. These saints have been seeking the Lord for a long time for a place to meet and when they finally met some of the local saints, they really felt like they found a new home!

January 23

We started the day off with more prayer and coordination with the saints. In the evening, we all went to a home meeting where we were able to meet many of the local students. It was very encouraging to see everyone participating and asking great questions! There were also a couple students who expressed their interest to attend the Full-time Training in London.

Italy (Vicenza)

January 21

In our coordination this morning, we joined the corporate fellowship with the other FTTA gospel trip teams who had just begun their orientation sessions. We must see that there is a great opportunity here and if we really see the vision of the great human image in Daniel 2 regarding the Lord's return, then we will be those who offer ourselves to the Lord willingly.

For our gospel time, we set up the table at the same location in downtown Vicenza and continued to enjoy the Lord with many Italian hymns—something the saints had been practicing. The Lord was able to arrange many divine appointments and we were able to meet some seeking ones who received the *Basic Elements of the Christian Life* booklet.

While we were tabling, some gospel contacts joined us, including H, whom we had met two days earlier, and G, and her daughter, whom the saints have been regularly meeting with. They joined in on the singing and enjoyed being part of the gospel. The Lord has been blessing our tabling times greatly. Despite not being able to go onto a campus, there have been many young ones we were able to contact in this busy location. With the entire team laboring in that area, we have been living a testimony of the Lord for all of Vicenza to witness!

In the evening some saints had more visitations: Some brothers went to go to visit brother S in his house to have fellowship. Other saints drove to Padova to join a college meeting. A couple met with student I who is very positive and excited to read the Word. She was surprised and interested in our gospel preaching activities and wanted to learn more from us. Three saints went to Trieste for a few days to visit saints.

January 22

We continued our tabling and met many contacts today—especially some high school and college students—who were invited to the gospel dinner we had been planning for January 24. One sister we contacted L, who was very open and loves the Lord. She was disappointed by the current state of Christianity and had many questions about the Bible, bringing up things like the New Jerusalem and Christmas.

For the evening, some brothers went to brother S's home for a bible study with his school friends and others, into the homes of different saints. One sister, F, whom we had dinner with, expressed her gratitude in our cherishing of her son whom we had taught to play hymn 1086. The father of another family we visited was slowly opening up his heart as we sang some hymns and pray-read some verses.

January 23

Today was the last day of distribution. At the table, the team enjoyed the Lord by singing many hymns with an exercised spirit. We found that this became a strong testimony of the Lord during the midday busyness on the quiet streets. Even more so, the singing drew out the spirit of the saints to just really enjoy the Lord as the rising sun in the cold weather.

In the evening, all the saints visited five different homes to cherish and nourish some local saints and gospel contacts. Many saints were touched by the human care given to their children and even our entrance in their homes being a blessing of the Lord's presence. These home visitations have been a top highlight for many of the saints visiting on the gospel trip.

The Lord answered our prayers by bringing 11 new ones to the pizza connect! Some of the student brothers shared about the gospel of John and we read a ministry portion over it in groups.

January 23-24

We went ice skating in the morning, then toured Warsaw's old town. In the evening we joined multiple home meetings for dinner, singing, and fellowship. On January 24, we split up and preached the gospel in Warsaw to people near two different metro stations. Two people we talked to, K and A, received Bibles. Then we had a lunch appointment with J, who we had been praying for. The Lord answered our prayers! After lunch we went to a museum with J, and then took J to the meeting hall for dinner and a meeting with students. After dinner we had a meeting where we sang together and overflowed our enjoyment of the Lord as the jubilee and as grace.

Overall, there have been very encouraging developments happening on this campus. May the Lord continue to bless the labor on Bellevue College!

January 22

Today was more appointment-oriented with a total of four appointments occurring among us. There were two on the brother's side and two on the sisters' side, each one being very positive in terms of our contacts' receptiveness to our speaking. S is a non-believer, but he very much enjoyed what we had to say. The same is true for our contact A, who was raised Christian but is only now really seeking. The sisters had a great experience as well, fellowshipping with their contact V who is really looking forward to meeting us next week. Once our time on campus was up, we had the Thursday night college meeting where we overflowed our experience on Bellevue College and prayed for these ones as well as the ones we didn't get to meet.

We found that most students were extremely open and willing to receive the Bible and the *Basic Elements of the Christian Life* and hear about how to use it. When we are rejected by one student, another student came up to us and asked for a Bible. At the "rekindle time" on campus later that evening, we entered into the priesthood. From singing time to the message, the students were able to answer questions and share what they enjoyed about the priesthood. Afterwards, we went to a saint's home to have a bonfire, and it was so sweet to sing hymn after hymn with the students.

January 21

We traveled to Gainesville on January 21, and went to the young working saints' meeting in the evening. They also invited five students to come and hear about the Training, providing the opportunity for each trainee to share our testimony. So we followed God's inner anointing to share our experiences of salvation, how we decided to go to the training and the enjoyment from the training. Afterwards, the students told us they really enjoyed the testimony.

January 22

On January 22, we started to coordinate with the team in Gainesville, and have tabling at Santa Fe College, a local community college. The Lord has really opened this campus and we were able to distribute 45 Bibles in just over an hour and a half on campus. Afterwards, we had a Bible study on campus. A sister who is also a professor invited a few of her students to come and join us. It's such a testimony that she can't help but share this wonderful God to her students and this attracted them to come for the Bible study, home meetings and so on. Eventually, we had the "Journey" of the Bible in Exodus in the evening, where we received a birds-eye view into the main thought in the Exodus. There were several students who visited the club for the first time, and we were encouraged by their strong participation and sharing to the group.


