Report and Prayer Burdens 12
January 26, 2026

EUROPE

France (Paris)

January 26

During the first Lord's Table meeting in Lille, we heard many testimonies from saints involved in shepherding and from those reached through gospel outreach and Bible distributions. The atmosphere was full of thanksgiving, joy, praise, and glory to God.

January 27

During gospel outreach, we met a man from Senegal who received a Bible, prayed to receive the Lord, and is open to joining on Saturday. We also met another man who called on the Lord with us and scheduled a follow-up appointment. At the same time, the sisters read the Bible with a new one who prayed to receive the Lord and later joined a small group meeting.

France (Toulouse)

January 24

We had a sweet time of fellowship with the students and young working saints in French, English, and Spanish. The Lord has been burdening us for these ones to enter and co-work with the serving ones to nourish and shepherd the new ones.

January 25

The Lord's table was full of praise, and the prophesying time was very enjoyable. Almost all the saints were able to share their portion within the available time, and the local saints were very helpful in translating for the trainees.

Prayer burdens:

1. That the Lord would gain the sons of peace at Science Po Toulouse on January 27th, and at Université Paul Sabatier on the 29th.
2. For the perfecting of the new saints to help nourish and shepherd others in the homes.



Germany (Berlin)

January 25

We were split into two districts for the Lord's Day table and prophesying meeting. In the afternoon, we met with the Farsi-speaking saints, heard their testimonies, and prayed for the Lord to have a way among the people in Iran for His testimony.

January 26

The brothers had lunch with a student from Technische Universität Berlin, and later held a Bible study with four brothers, enjoying Eph. 4:17–32 on the Christian daily walk. The sisters visited Freie Universität Berlin and fellowshipped with sisters during the campus tour. In the evening, the sisters had a dinner appointment with two students. There was sweet fellowship and the sharing of personal testimonies, and the students were very open in sharing their experiences of the Lord. We sensed that they had genuinely touched the Lord and gained a fresh vision of Him.

Prayer burdens:

1. That the saints in Berlin would be strengthened and united with the Farsi-speaking saints, and that the Lord would open the eyes and soften the hearts of the people in Iran for His testimony.
2. That the students would be available and willing to attend meetings and Bible studies, and be drawn into deeper fellowship and enjoyment of Christ.
3. That the Lord would go before us in campus outreach and air-tabling, opening doors and hearts—especially among Germans—so many would receive the gospel and attend the Jan 30, 2026, gospel meeting.

Luxembourg

January 23

After fellowship, we went to Belval city center to distribute Bibles in five languages and had many conversations with people from across Europe, some interested in Bible studies. Student O came for his first Bible-reading appointment; we read John 1, prayed, and he expressed a desire to continue studying. We also met a Chinese-speaking brother, saved in Taiwan and recovered last year, who said reading the Word with the brothers brings him life. He is seeking a job in Luxembourg so he can stay and continue meeting with the saints.

January 24

We arrived in Lille around 3 p.m. at a facility that can host over 200 saints. The mini-conference, on The Preparation of the Bride (messages 1 and 2), highlighted loving the Lord and maintaining oneness after offenses—healthy words for the local church in Lille on the 25th. A sister who recently moved to Lille and another senior sister with a long-term visa attended, both seeking the Lord's leading for the future. We also met a sister who had previously joined the Torch Relay gospel trip in Italy and returned to witness Lille's first Lord's table meeting.

January 25

After breakfast, we gathered for the first Lord's table in Lille, with about 227 saints attending in person and over 150 joining online from six countries. Saints who had labored over the years shared powerful testimonies of 20 years of prayer, the Lord's calling in 2023–2024, and the Body's response.

NORTH AMERICA

Canada

Nanaimo, BC / Vancouver, BC / Victoria, BC

January 21

In anticipation for the upcoming FIFA World Cup, we joined the full-timers to scout high-traffic locations in downtown Vancouver for distributing Bibles. We organized three teams across three different locations throughout downtown. During this time, we distributed 41 Bibles.

January 22

We joined a Bible study at UBC (University of British Columbia) with 35 students in attendance, following that the sisters joined a girl small group fellowship that had six students and it was very encouraging as we welcomed three new ones. Later in the evening, we had dinner with our hospitality families.

January 23

We tabled for Bibles for Canada (BfC) at UBC, where we distributed 117 bibles. In the evening, we had a combined college and young people's meeting with 263 attendees, where we shared our testimonies in light of Matthew, chapters 19 and 20, emphasising that they are not too young to give their lives to the Lord and make a fresh consecration to Him.

January 24

We departed Vancouver and traveled to Nanaimo with six full-time serving ones. We spent the evening at a sister's home for dinner, singing and fellowship with 43 attending, including both saints and gospel friends. There, we shared personal testimonies about how the Lord drew each of us to the training. The Lord was able to use this time to infuse faith to the dear students there.

January 25

Though not yet a lampstand, this morning we were refreshed and supplied by one another's portion of Christ at the Lord's day meeting with 44 in attendance. Afterward, we headed to downtown Nanaimo to distribute gospel tracts, then spent the evening having dinner and further fellowship with the local saints.

January 26

We tabled at Vancouver Island University (VIU) with local saints and students. We distributed 57 Bibles with many international students from Ghana, India, Nigeria, and other nations showing openness to hear the gospel. The atmosphere was prayerful and full of faith as the team worked together, with many students taking Bibles, some sharing the table's location with their friends, and the Lord sovereignly bringing people who were genuinely seeking.

January 23

We had coordination and prayer for the evening college meeting. That evening, 52 attended, including 30 students—some for the first time. Our topic was “The Revelation of Jesus Christ and Loving Him with Our First Love,” and the students responded very positively during the breakout groups.

January 24

In the morning we left to begin our trip towards Philadelphia. We traveled part way with the saints from Pittsburgh and met the saints from Philadelphia at State College. We arrived in the evening and met with two families.

January 25

The Lord’s Day prophesying time was held on Zoom. We were at different homes and enjoyed the time.
