EUROPE

Latvia

January 25

Today we had a wonderful Lord's table and prophesying meeting with all the saints from Lithuania. In the evening, we traveled to Riga, Latvia.

January 26

Today was our first full day in Riga, where we had coordination with the team in Riga and began preaching the gospel at Riga Technical University. January 23-26

Connecticut

January 23

We joined some of the students at Central Connecticut State University for an outing to enjoy getting to know some of the students more. In the evening we had the first college meeting of the semester which was at the sisters' house. The time was very vibrant and rich in singing and fellowship on Christ being the fulfillment of seasons and new beginnings.

January 24

We gathered together at the hall with some saints for corporate morning revival and cleaning the hall. Then we enjoyed a love-feast style brunch, getting to know the saints in Newington more. We took a small outing with some families, students, and young couples to visit the oldest town in Connecticut and learn a little more about the history. Then we traveled out to a family's home for dinner, singing, and rich fellowship.

January 25-26

On Lord's Day, a large snowstorm hit Connecticut and we received over a foot of snow, so the saints gathered together over Zoom and we enjoyed the time blending with our host families. On Monday, we had coordination over Zoom and continued enjoying the Lord and reading the ministry together. In the afternoon, we spent a few hours shoveling the parking lot of the meeting hall. Afterwards, we enjoyed playing in the snow with some of the children. In the evening we had dinner and fellowship with the young working saints' small group.

January 23

In the evening, the trainees were divided among four families who opened their homes for small group blending meetings on the Upper West Side of Manhattan. We invited our contacts from the week, and each home had around 15 saints. We were encouraged to see young families, young working saints, and college-aged saints making genuine connections and fellowshiping together. There was mutual sharing of testimonies, enjoyment, and questions about the training.

January 24

The young people from Boston came down to New York for sightseeing and a time of blending with the young people in New York. Later in the evening, we drove to Nutley. We arrived at the meeting hall in Nutley, New Jersey, where there was a blending meeting with young people from Nutley, Millburn, and Fair Lawn. The trainees were asked to share their testimony and enjoyment, and some former trainees also shared their testimonies.

January 25

We got snowed in, so we had the Lord's Day table meeting on Zoom. We joined the English-speaking meeting with around 45 saints including young people. During the prophesying meeting, many saints shared their experiences concerning both vertical fellowship and horizontal fellowship.

For lunch and dinner, we joined our hosting families, and other saints and contacts were also invited. On the brothers' side, a family joined us for lunch, and a new brother joined for dinner. On the sisters' side, gospel friends joined for dinner.

Prayer burdens:

1. That the young people and college age would become companions and enter into personal and small group bible reading.
2. That the local saints, new ones and contacts that we have met would continue to blend and be built up into the normal church life.



Southeast

North Charleston, SC / Greensboro, NC / Myrtle Beach, SC / Wilmington, NC

January 22

We tabled at Coastal Carolina University (CCU), distributing free Bibles and spiritual literature. Many students were open and happy to receive a free Bible. We also had several impromptu Bible studies. One student ran up to us, very excited to see Christians giving away Bibles. She shared that she and her roommate have been praying for a revival on their campus.

January 23

This was our second day of tabling at CCU. The students continued to be very open and receptive. We distributed more Bibles and had additional impromptu Bible studies. A few students mentioned they still had Bibles they received last year. By the end, we ran out of all our material. It is clear that the Lord is working on the campus and stirring up a seeking in the students for His Word.

January 24

This was a day of rest and blending. In the evening, we had a dinner meeting in the home of a new family with four young people. We spent time interacting with the young people and enjoyed mutual shepherding. It was very encouraging to see them so happy to sing hymns with us and share Bible verses they had been enjoying.
