Report and Prayer Burdens 15

January 29, 2026

EUROPE

France (Paris)

January 27-29

During a productive two-day visit to Université Paris-Saclay, the team had 11 appointments, three new contacts, distributed two Bibles and four tracts. One student was particularly moved by the concept of the soul as a vessel for the spirit while another appreciated seeing the Word becoming flesh. Another saw music as a means to contact God. All of them agreed to future fellowship and the upcoming seminar.

Prayer burdens:

1. For these students to develop a solid Bible-reading habit.
2. For local shepherds to rise up and care for these ones on campus.
3. For the Saturday seminar!



Germany (Berlin)

January 27

We started the morning with enjoying the Lord at our coordination with the full-time team. Then we went to the Technical University in Berlin (TU) where we tabled. We tried to have conversations with students by asking them to take a survey that asked them questions that would stir up the eternity in their heart. We were surprised by the effectiveness of this – we were able to have 20 conversations with people of all religious backgrounds.

In the afternoon, some of the sisters had an appointment with a new student from TU where she called on the Lord, and the brothers had an appointment with two young people.

In the evening, one pair had dinner with hospitality while the other four had dinner with a family. After dinner, we all went to the prayer meeting and joined in on the saints' burdens for the church in Berlin and the Lord's move in the world situation today - particularly in Europe and Iran.

January 28

In the morning, the sisters had coordination while the brothers met with a young working saint. Afterwards, our team split into two groups: one group attended a Bible study at the Free University of Berlin (FU) and the other went to Humboldt University of Berlin (HU) for an appointment with a student.

At the Bible study at FU, we covered the difference between the heart and the human soul and heard the testimony of one student. During the appointment at HU, we connected with a new student and invited them to the Christian Students in Berlin event on Thursday evening.

In the evening, we remained in two groups and went to the saints' homes for dinner, fellowship, and testimonies.

January 29

In the morning, we joined the full-time team for coordination. Afterwards, we went to the Technical University of Berlin (TU), where we tabled and continued using the survey method to engage students in conversation. Again, we were pleasantly surprised by the effectiveness of the survey, which allowed us to have many meaningful conversations with students about their religious backgrounds and to minister Christ to them.

Partway through the tabling time, one group joined the full-time team to attend the Bible study at Humboldt University (HU), where we read Luke 6. We were encouraged to see Christ as our true Sabbath and to realize that He came not to abolish the law, but to fulfill it. The high standard of morality revealed in this chapter shows that we are being made like our Father in life and in nature – not through our own striving, but through Christ living in us. Meanwhile, the rest of the group continued tabling at TU.

In the evening, we all came together to attend the Christian Students in Berlin event where we covered Jesus as “the Beloved” to the Father.

Prayer burdens:

1. For the Lord to release the ones to attend the gospel meeting on the evening of January 30.
2. For our blending time with the 20+ young people in Berlin this Saturday, January 31, and that the Lord would meet the young peoples' needs through us.
3. For the Lord to release further appointments with our contacts during our time in Berlin.



Germany (Düsseldorf)

January 28

We had our last day preaching the gospel at Heinrich Heine University (HHU) in Düsseldorf and had a few solid conversations. In the evening we joined the college meeting and were encouraged to see a student who was gained during a previous gospel trip.

January 29

In the morning, we distributed Bibles at the University of Duisburg-Essen (UDE) in Essen. During lunch, the brothers had a second appointment with H who will be coming to the college meeting on Friday, January 30, and the sisters had a third appointment with M and a local student. For the college meeting this week, we will be at the new student center in Essen! Praise the Lord for His timely release of this facility for the students and saints in the Ruhr region.

Prayer burdens:

1. That the Lord would continue to brood over the Heinrich Heine University campus.
2. For the follow-up with the students met on the gospel, especially that they would be connected with local saints.
3. For the Lord to bless the new student center in Essen and the first meeting there on January 30.



Latvia / Lithuania

January 28

Today we went to the University of Latvia and Riga Technical University to preach the gospel to students. Afterwards, we visited the meeting hall that the saints are building. We then enjoyed dinner with the saints and concluded the day with a wonderful prayer meeting.

January 29

Today we had coordination in the morning. Afterward, the trainees went to Riga Technical University to preach the gospel, while the full-timers prepared for the conference that will take place tomorrow. Following the gospel time, the trainees helped with conference preparations before going to the saints' homes for dinner.

Luxembourg

January 26

After a restful morning, we went to the Luxembourg city center for a tour. During lunch, we spoke with the cashier and asked if he had ever read the Bible. He told us he had received a Bible in London but had never read it. We shared with him the mystery of human life – that God desires to spread from our spirit to our soul and eventually to our whole being.

When we asked if he believed in God, he said he was seeking God. We quoted a verse “That if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.” He called on the Lord and was saved, and one of the brothers exchanged contact information with him for follow-up.

January 27

We went out to distribute Bibles near Belval University. It was rainy, and there were not many people around, yet the Lord still blessed us with a handful of contacts who were willing to leave their phone numbers for a Bible study. We later sent follow-up text messages; in total, we had 17 contacts.

In the afternoon, four members had dinner in Diekirch with a mother and son who had moved there recently. They sang a hymn in Spanish, read a booklet, and enjoyed fellowship together. Even with reading in three different languages at the same time, there was still the miraculous yet normal way to have fellowship with one another with the help of one of the serving brothers who could translate. The son opened up about his struggles with schoolwork and the language barrier. The atmosphere was full of love, thanksgiving, and praise.
